## THE STATS

- Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) are common. In a classroom of 30 children, approximately 18 children (60%) will have experienced at least one ACE, and about four children (15%) will have experienced four or more ACEs.
- Behaviors in the classroom may be a symptom of trauma and adversity occurring at home.
- Safe, stable, and nurturing relationships, like those educators can provide, have been shown to improve outcomes for children who have experienced trauma/adversity.
- ACEs can lead to a lifetime of chronic physical and mental health issues, including depression, cancer, heart disease, and drug misuse. Learn more <u>here</u>.
